Business Meeting

Season II of *Being Human* is coming. Coming out in December is a new Sherlock Holmes movie starring Robert Downey Jr. as Holmes and Jude Law as Watson.

In book store news, Rob reported that there is a price war going on between Walden Books and Amazon.com. And a new reader from Barnes & Noble is out; it's called The Nook.

Rob passed around two issues of *Sigma*, the newsletter of the Pittsburgh area's sci-fi group.


The next LSF book club discussion will be held on the 1st Thursday in December; they'll discuss Stephanie Meyer's *The Host*.




2012 a short review by Wess


