## 2012 Gaylactic Spectrum Awards

The winner of the 2012 Gaylactic Spectrum Award for Best Novel (and Recommended Short List) were announced at this year's Gaylaxicon 2012.

The 2012 Best Novel is Honeved Words (Tor, 2011) by J.A. Pitts. It's the follow-up urban fantasy novel to Black Blade Blues (which was included on the Gavalactic Spectrum Short List for 2011). Boiling it all down to two sentences: "It's not every day that you discover you've reforged a magical sword, but that's exactly what blacksmith Sarah Beauhall did, and she soon finds out that a heroine's work is never done... Whether you're looking for a fresh presentation of LGBT content or well-crafted fantasy in an urban setting, Honeyed Words will draw you deeper into the lives of these very engaging chracters, not the least of whom is Sarah Jane Beauhall herself."

The following novels comprise the Gaylactic Spectrum Recommended ShortList for 2012:

The Gaylactic Spectrum Awards were created in 1998 to honor works in science fiction, fantasy, and horror that include positive explorations of gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered characters, themes, or issues. The Awards are administered by The Gaylactic Spectrum Awards Foundation.

The winners and Recommended Short Lists for the 2012 Best Short Fiction and Best Other categories (works originally published in North America in 2010 or 2011) will be announced next year at Gaylaxicon 2013 (Atlanta, May 3-5, 2013). Nominations for the 2013 Best Novel (for novels first published in North America in 2012) are being accepted until March 31, 2013.

#### LSF October Meeting Minutes taken by Scott

Teresa initiated a traditional name circle to introduce all of the meeting attendees.

Carl commented that he liked Charles Stross's Rule 34 (this October's book discussion) even better than Glass House (previous book discussion).

TV discussions: Teresa dislikes the current version of Beauty & the Beast - with Beauty being an unconvincing police detective. The idea of an NYC residence owned by Satan in new 666 Park Avenue TV show was compared to a similar conceit in the film Devil's Advo*cate*. Internal plot inconsistencies were cited in both the film Looper and the recent Doctor Who season finale, which feratured the the Weeping Angels. Peter described the brief Amy/Rory postscript (BBC-produced and not fan-produced), Krista sniffled at. Season 3 of AMC's The Walking Dead premieres tonight. (Hershel gets bitten!) The new season of American Horror Story starts with a new story and same cast members in different roles. The new series Arrow features a "dark" Oliver Queen, who kills off some people in the first episode. Note that a character named Dinah appears – a future Black Canary? And Peter and Rob and Carl all enjoy the new series Elementary (a Sherlock Holmes pastiche)!

Film discussions: Dan described the movie Robot & Frank: an ex-jewel thief who receives a robot as a gift from his son; the robot is convinced to participate in a heist with the ex-jewel thief (starring

Frank Langella and Susan Sarandon). A new, grittier Superman movie - starring muscular Henry Cavill - is planned for release in 2013. The Perks of Being a Wallflower (featured in an earlier LSF book discussion) is now a movie, featuring Emma Watson. There are at least three versions of trailers for the new film Cloud Atlas-romance, action and sci-fi. A faithful film adaptation of A Wrinkle in Time is in the works.

Jim W. reported on this year's CapClave convention up in Gaithersburg. He said that author George R.R. Martin is slated as guest author at next year's CapClave. He also announced that he contributed to the kickstarter project for the Tesla Museum in upstate New York.

Rob told everyone about the Spectrum Award Best Novel and Short List winners, as announced at Gaylaxicon. [Ed. Note: See article on page 1 of this newsletter.]

Next, Rob reminded everyone of the upcoming selections for the LSF Book Discussion Group: Rule 34 by Charles Stross (October), A Book of Tongues by Gemma Files (November/December), and Cloud Atlas by David Mitchell (January). It was noted that Cloud Atlas is not a "summer beach read" and that adequate time should be allocated to read the book!

Carl noted that he picked up a DVD of the 1930's sci-fi musical film Just Imagine at Gaylaxicon. Perhaps it'll be shown at a future LSF video party?

Carl also participated in the Saturday morning Gaylactic Network Board meeting, where official approval was given for the Atlanta Outworlders to host Gaylaxicon 2013 in Atlanta. [Loud cheers!]

### Jeffrey Catherine Jones 1944 – 2011

I only recently learned that Jeff Jones (one of my favorite F&SF artists) passed away in May 2011. I was visiting DreamHaven Books, Comics, and Art during this year's Gaylaxicon, where I bought a back issue of *Illustration* (one of favorite magazines). The magazine featured an "In Memoriam" article about Jones – an article that included information about Jones's change of gender in 1998.

Jeffrey Durwood Jones (aka "Jeff Jones") was known for his work in comics and cover illustration during the 1960s and 1970s.

After graduating from Georgia State College, Jones and his wife Mary moved to NYC in 1967. (The couple were separated in the early 1970s.) Jones found work drawing comics for King Comics, Gold Key, and such magazines as *Creepy*, *Eerie*, and *Vampirella*. He created striking cover illustrations for over 150 books, including the Ace editions of Fritz Leiber's "Fafhrd and the Gray Mouser" series and such Andre Norton novels as *Postmarked the Stars*, *The Zero Stone*, and *Uncharted Stars*. His works were also featured in such magazines as *Fantastic* (early 1970s), *National Lampoon* (1972-1975), and *Heavy Metal* (early 1980s).

Jones was nominated for and/or won a number of prestigious F&SF awards. He was nominated for a Hugo as Best Fan Artist in 1967 and for Best Professional Artist in 1970, 1971, and 1972. He was first nominated for the World Fantasy Award for Best Artist in 1975 – and won the award in 1986. Jones was also nominated for the Chesley Award in 1999. On more than one occasion, Frank Frazetta referred to Jeff Jones as "the greatest living painter."

However, this prolific output took its toll, and Jones decided it was time to retire from commercial art and turn to fine art, with the idea of making a living from the sale of prints and portfolios. From 1975 to 1979, Jones shared workspace in Manhattan with fellow F&SF artists Bernie Wrightson, Barry Windsor-Smith, and Mike Kaluta – collectively known as "The Studio."

Later in life, Jones recalled wanting to be a girl from her earliest memories. She confronted these issues in 1998 and began hormone replacement therapy. She changed her name to Jeffrey Catherine Jones and was legally recognized as female. In 2006, during a candid interview with *Locus* editor Arnie Fenner, Jones said: "I thought it would make me less depressed and I was wrong... the only thing I can do at this point is accept things as they are. And I think I have. Besides, what other choice do I have?"

Quoting the obituary in *Illustration*: "Maintaining a life of artistic freedom came at a great price, and the artist had trouble making ends meet over the years. She was also plagued by personal problems which led to a nervous breakdown in 2001, and the loss of her home and studio. It took a few years for her to recover to the point where she could paint and draw again."

Jones passed away on May 19, 2011, surrounded by family, friends, and loved ones. She is survived by her daughter Julianna–and a magnificent legacy of stunning F&SF art.
