

(HOPSY and DORA move to the second level and start to groom.)


HOPSY: So, dear, how are you settling in?

Space travel may finally be a possibility-for a hefty price. Travel tycoon Sir Richard Branson's Virgin Galactic (virgingalactic.com; from \$250,000) has already made test runs in the Mojave Desert. His Spaceship Two is expected to send six passengers at once hurtling into zero g's starting Next up: entrepreneur this year. Michiel Mol's SXC (spacexc.com; from \$95,000). Once it's up and running, SXC's Mojave campus will offer daily service to the edge of Earth's atmosphere in a specially designed spacecraft that will give passengerastronauts a stunning view of the planet from more than 60 miles up. The line behind these two risk-takers is long, but other companies are launching commercial travel to spaceincluding Jeff Bezos's Blue Origin, starting in 2016.

There was a discussion about *Captain America: The Winter Soldier*; most attendees liked it, but the Bucky Barnes Big Reveal was not surprising to most. Everyone loves Chris Evans! Did you notice the Apple store geek employee cruising Steve Rodgers in the film?

Awesome Con is next week at the convention center; Teresa read off the list of guests and activities. Peter distributed a flyer for *Confluence* (a speculative fiction con in Pittsburgh). Rob might be attending the World Fantasy Convention in Arlington in November – mainly because the GoH will be Guy Gavriel Kay.

BBC America will be showing a four-part series on science fiction. Season Two of Orphan Black is about to start. (The show's premise is that several identical women appear to be clones.) A new series titled Penny Dreadful will premiere in May on Showtime looks like it might have some steampunk and Victorian Gothic elements. Season IV of Games of Thrones has begun; it's based upon the second half of the third book in the series by George R.R. Martin. The Canadian CGI series Reboot may get rebooted. Rob is enjoying the French TV series Returned, which is similar to the ABC-TV series Resurrection.

The Amazing Spiderman 2, X-Men: Days of Future Past, and

Godzilla movies are all coming out in May. The character Rogue apparently did not make it off the cutting room floor in the *X-Men* movie.

During the meeting, Rob received an e-mail that Gaylaxicon 2015 (Boston) has been cancelled and that refunds are being issued.

Carl passed around some new American Library Association bookmarks that we will be handing out at the LSF table at this year's Capitol Pride Day event; they feature Captain America, Spiderman, Iron Man, Thor, and the Hulk.

Teresa recommended a book she's currently reading titled *Slimed*, about the oral history of Nickelodeon's golden age. Peter recalled a book he read as a kid, *The 21 Balloons* by William Pène du Bois; it's about a retired schoolteacher who takes a balloon trip to a fantastical land. Carl highly recommended a new book by Caitlin Kiernan, a collection of short stories titled *Alabaster: Pale Horse*.

Wess said that actress Denise Crosby (from *Star Trek: The Next Generation*) looks like "a real person" now that she looks dumpy. (She has appeared in the series *The Walking Dead.*)

Peter reported that new *Doctor Who* episodes are being filmed now, and that a young black male is being cast as a companion. Several people noted that John Barrowman ("Captain Jack") has appeared on *Arrow*.

Rob reminded everyone that the next LSF Book Discussion Group title is *Glory Season* by David Brin. Also, the next LSF gaming party will be held on Saturday, April 26, at Peter and Rob's place.

Tidbits from Wayne #1

Heroes, off-air since 2010, will return to NBV with 13 episodes in 2015. *Heroes–Reborn* will be execproduced by creator Tim Kring. [*Entertainment Magazine*]

The recent film *Noah's Ark* required one million hours for F/X wizards at Industrial Light & Magic, their most ever. This is the equivalent of working 24/7 for 38 years. [NPR]

"Spirit & Opportunity–10 Years Roving Across Mars" – an exhibit at the Smithsonian Air & Space Museum through Sept. 14, 2014.

The Lost World (1925 silent adaptation of the Arthur Conan Doyle novel) was the first in-flight film: on the April 6, 1925, on a British Imperial Airlines Croyden-to-New York flight. The orchestral soundtrack was piped to the passengers using crystal radio wi-fi (probably at exceedingly high volume to compete with the cabin noise). [Smithsonian Air & Space Magazine]

Philip Seymour Hoffman was scheduled to appear in the next two *Hunger Games* films. [*Entertainment Magazine*]

Seemingly maxed out at 30 million subscribers, HBO is aiming to expand its membership further by using Hip-Hop to promote its shows, beginning with the current season of *Game of Thrones*. {NPR]

Alamogordo, NM recently approved six-months access to the municipal landfill to Fuel Industries (the Canadian filmdoc company) in order to prove or disprove the supposed September 1983 dumping of several million copies of "E.T.: The Video Game" and "Ms. PacMan". The outcry over the size and toxicity of the dump caused an uproar that resulted in expedited passage of the New Mexico Emergency (Waste) Management Act. [NPR]
