Be that as it may, I have no clear explanation as to why I decided to buy a copy of Barker's latest novel, *The Scarlet Gospels*. Ya see, *The Scarlet Gospels* has some very clear links to the gorier side of Clive Barker: it brings back the Hell Priest, "one of the most famous characters in the pantheon of horror" – better known as "Pinhead". Yes, Pinhead, who first appeared about 30 years ago in Barker's novel *The Hellbound Heart* (1986) and was so memorably portrayed in the film *Hellraiser* (1987) and its sequels.

But, wait, there's more! The Scarlet Gospels also features the return of Harry D'Amour, a private investigator who specializes in cases involving the occult. (D'Amour first appeared in "The Last Illusion" and has made appearances over the years in several other Barker novels and short stories.) Hmm... maybe that's it. I've always enjoyed PI stories - and, as I said, I did enjoy the film Lord of Illusions, featuring Scott Bakula as Harry D'Amour. (Although, as it turns out, The Scarlet Gospels isn't anything like a PI story.) At any rate... Here they are! Pinhead and D'Amour, together again... for the first (and probably last) time!

The Scarlet Gospels, In D'Amour accidentally finds himself in possession of a Lament Configuration, one of the intricate puzzle boxes that are rumored to open a doorway to Hell. (These boxes were featured in all the "Hellraiser" films.) Meantime, the Hell Priest has been wreaking havoc throughout the world's occult communities: he's killing off all the dark magicians (quite graphically, I might add) and gathering up all their mystical texts and paraphernalia. Pinhead has plans - very ambitious plans - and Harry D'Amour has unfortunately gotten dragged into those plans.

The Scarlet Gospels is definitely a creepy – and fascinating – read. And if you're a big fan of the works of Clive Barker, I think it's absolutely a "must read".

H.P. Lovecraft: The Mysterious Man Behind the Darkness by Charlotte Montague (Chartwell Books, 2015)

This book hit the stands at Barnes & Noble – on the discount shelves, no less – just in time for the Halloween season! I simply couldn't resist!

It's a lavishly-illustrated book about Lovecraft. Yes, it tells the story of his life; but it also includes synopses of many of his works (as they come up in the narrative of his life), excerpts from his diaries and letters, and sidebars about the people in his life: his friends, his family, his influences, his "writing circles", and so on. The last three chapters specifically deal with Lovecraft's posthumous legacy: the contributors to the so-called "Cthulhu Mythos" (a term originated by August Derleth) and their books and films. And, as I said, it's lavishly-illustrated with photographs and reproductions of paintings and book and magazines covers - even a copy of the "Map of the Principal Parts of Arkham, Massachusetts" hand-drawn by Lovecraft in early 1934. What a treasure trove!

Montague certainly doesn't pull any punches in her descriptions of Lovecraft's personal beliefs. Right from the start, she states: "After all, he was decidedly racist, vehemently reactionary and viewed all 'direct erotic manifestations' as repellent. He was frustratingly uncommercial, disdainful of democracy and resolutely against technological progress." On the other hand, "...this misanthropic visionary also displayed extraordinary kindness to those who knew him and corresponded with him ... " And on the other "other hand", I couldn't help but feel sorry for his long-suffering wife, Sonia Greene (who was a businesswoman and Jewish). I was also surprised to learn how many gay men were members of his "circle".

I think Montague's *H.P. Love*craft is an absolute "must have" for any serious Lovecraft fan. I'm certainly glad that I own a copy! $\Lambda\Psi\Phi$
