As you might know, we've had a booth at Pride every year since the formation of the club. We promote the club and our events: we hand out bookmarks; we get email addresses for our mailing list; we promote Gaylaxicons; etc. We generally get around 40 valid new email addresses from our day at Pride, and generally a handful of people will get involved in our activities from it each year. Unfortunately the cost of having our table at Pride has risen significantly over the years - with this year's booth costing us about \$280 (only because we got a discount for signing up early). The bottom line: the Pride booth, while getting our name out there, eats up about 70-80% of our annual incoming funds and generates little to



no extra income over the year. We're slowly going to go broke at this rate. So...


My suggestion is to approach the other big local LGBTQA+ fandom group - Geeks Out DC - to see if they might be interested in sharing the booth and the cost with us. We've been cross-promoting events on Facebook with the Geeks Out folks for the last several months, and there's definitely some group crossover. We tend to have a different array of events than they do, so they're less a competitor and more an "alternative" for folks interested in activities we don't generally do. We've already booked this year's table; and, if the club thinks it's a worthwhile idea. I can approach Geeks Out DC about sharing this year and in the future.

So, please give this some thought, and discuss it at the February meeting (which I unfortunately will miss). Based on the club's decision, I'll follow up or not.

Minutes of the January LSF Meeting

A bitter-cold day outside!

Business Items: The current set of LSF officers was re-elected by acclamation. LSF might propose a genre panel for this year's Awesome Con; Rob will craft a programming idea and share it for feedback.

TV News: Only a few episodes of The Travelers so far -Quantum Leap-style time travelers from the future supplant the bodies four others to save world. Powerless is a DC Universe TV series: an R&D team at Wayne Enterprises develops products for regular humans who might get caught in battles between superheroes and supervillians. Rob discussed the new series Emerald City, a grim, dark version of The Wizard of Oz. He also says that the first season of Lucifer is hilarious: Lucifer comes to Los Angeles and battle crime. (35 episodes so far. Great chemistry, great dialogue. Rob recommends it.) Net-flix's Sense8 "holiday special" is now available; the show works well for binge-watching but not so well for episode-watching. Teresa is suffering from Steven Moffatt fatigue. David is watching Frequency the main character uses her ham radio to speak with her dead father. Upcoming: a new series Time After Time - HG Wells uses his time machine to travel to our time chasing Jack the Ripper.

Film News: Lots of anguish over the plot of Passengers. (The Chris Pratt character gets away with "rape", his victim forgives him, and they live happily ever after - forreprehensible givable morality?) Rob feels that Arrival is an intelligent sci-fi movie. Peter and Rob loved Rogue One and the CGI representtations of Grand Moff Tarkin and Princess Leia. (Did you recognize the two male characters who some perceive as a gay couple?) David provided the plot for Timeless: an unlikely trio of a scientist, a soldier, and a history professor use a time machine to change events in the past.



Larry Smith 1946 – 2017

Larry (Laurence C.) Smith was a mainstay of science fiction conventions for decades; and he was a friend of lots and lots of fen. If you've visited the Dealers Room at almost any Midwest or East Coast convention – or any number of Worldcons – then you've probably stopped by Larry Smith Booksellers. And, if you're like many of us, you were one of Larry's loyal, devoted customers – and you'll miss him, too. Larry seemed to remember everybody and knew what they liked to read. He certainly knew the SF/F/H scene; he always had a recommendation; and he frequently gave you his opinion. He could also be a delightful curmudgeon.

Larry was also one of those dedicated fen who worked behind the scenes to keep sci-fi conventions going. He co-chaired the Columbus OH Worldcon bid in 1976; he chaired Marcon for a decade; he served as vice-chair of Chicon IV (1982); and he co-chaired the 2010 World Fantasy Convention. He acquired Dick Spelman's book business in the early 1990s (based in Ohio) and thereafter became a regular among convention booksellers. Odds were good that he also ran the dealer's room at any given convention, be it at a smaller local convention or at a Worldcon.

Larry unexpectedly passed away on January 20th, as his wife and business partner Sally Kobee was setting up at Chattacon (Chattanooga, TN). She immediately packed up and headed back home. Tributes to Larry from fen and authors from across the country – as well as heartfelt condolences to Sally – have been pouring into Facebook and other on-line sites.

Sir John Hurt 1940-2017

Actor John Hurt has died at the age of 77. He was one of the most respected actors of his generation. Over his 50-year career, he portrayed some of the most memorable characters in British film and television. He received 2



Academy Award nominations, a Golden Globe Award, and four BAFTA (British Academy of Film and Television Arts) Awards.

John Hurt was born in Chesterfield, Derbyshire in January 1940. In 1960, he won a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art, where he trained for two years.

Hurt's first film was The Wild and the Willing (1962); but he made his mark playing Richard Rich in the 1966 film A Man for All Seasons. He won a BAFTA Award for playing Quentin Crisp in the TV play The Naked Civil Servant (1975); and he won further acclaim for his role as the emperor Caligula in the 1976 series I, Claudius. In 1978 he won his first Academy Award nomination for Midnight Express (as "Max"), and he won a Golden Globe and a second BAFTA for it, too. Hurt also did voice-work in such animated films as Watership Down (1978, as "Hazel") and Lord of the Rings (1978, as "Aragorn"). In 1980 he played John Merrick in The Elephant Man, which earned him his second Academy Award nomination. Also in 1980, he gave memorable birth to a "chest-burster", as Kane in the film Alien. Four years later he played Winston Smith in the film adaptation of the George Orwell classic Nineteen Eighty-Four (opposite Richard Burton). Hurt appeared as "Ollivander" in several of the Harry Potter films and as "The Great Dragon" in the TV series Merlin (2012).

In 2013, at the age of 73, Hurt made his debut in *Doctor Who*, as "The War Doctor", a character invented by Steven Moffat to fill the gap in the series 50th Anniversary story "The Day of the Doctor". He also appeared in "The Name of the Doctor" and "The Night of the Doctor".

Sir John received a knighthood, for his services to drama, in the 2015 New Years Honours; and on July 17, 2015, at Windsor Castle, he was invested and received the accolade from Queen Elizabeth.
