My Hugo Nominations for 2017 Dramatic **Presentations**

As many of you know, I'm a media fan. My husband Rob and I met 25 years ago at the World Science Fiction convention. many years, been attending Worldcons, and for many years we've nominated and voted for works worthy of winning the Hugos. While I used to try to read all the nominated literature, I long ago gave up and now only nominate the best dramatic presentations for Hugos every year that I'm eligible. This is one of those years.

Back in January, I nominated the works in this article. such a traitor to my favorite show, Doctor Who. I didn't nominate any Doctor Who this year.):

Four of my Long Form nominations made it to the final ballot. Two of my Short Form nominations made the final ballot; and while my Games of Thrones nomination didn't make the final ballot, two other episodes of Game of Thrones from the same season made the final ballot.

When I voted, I ranked the Short Form nominations in the order shown below. (Again, I'm such a traitor to my favorite show, Doctor Who. I ranked the Doctor Who nomination fourth in the Short Form category.)

1. The Expanse: "Leviathan Wakes" - The Expanse is my favorite show on TV right now. The show follows the crew of the Canterbury and a lone detective as they try to solve a mystery and prevent the solar system from heading toward all-out war. Taking place 200+ years in the future, humanity is divided into three factions: Earthers, Martians, and Belters (who colonized the asteroid belt). Each faction deeply mistrusts the other two and make choices that,

while they may be good for their faction, may endanger humanity as a whole. This political drama does an amazing job of weaving multiple story lines together within a science fiction trapping. The writing, acting, production values, and special effects are top notch. The season finale, "Leviathan Wakes," ties the seemingly disparate season-long plot lines together, and left me satisfied but wanting more.

2 & 3. Game of Thrones: "The Door" and "Battle of the Bastards" - If you're not familiar with Game of Thrones, you live under a rock. This political drama does an amazing job of weaving multiple story lines together within a fantasy setting. The writing, acting, production values, and special effects are top notch. "The Door" bids adieu to a beloved character and explains why he only says one particular word every time he opens his mouth. Watching the episode was absolutely heart-wrenching. I cried. In the "Battle of the Bastards", two enemies from different houses face off in a final battle for control of one of the houses. I cheered the hero and booed the villain, a truly vile sadist.

4. Doctor Who: "The Return of Doctor Mysterio" - If you're not familiar with Doctor Who, you live under a rock. The last few seasons of Doctor Who have left me cold. Last year's Christmas special (the first new episode after a year of waiting) attempted to be a love letter to American superheroes. While there were cute homages to the superhero genre, the result fell flat.

I wasn't familiar with the other two nominees so I didn't vote for them: Black Mirror: "San Junipero" and Splendor & Misery [album].

In the Best Dramatic Presentation (Long Form) category, I ranked the nominees this way:

1. Hidden Figures - Hidden Figures is based on the real story of three African-American women who broke color and gender barriers at NASA and helped with the calculations necessary to get the Mercury astronauts into space. It's an amazing feel-good movie and a great history lesson. It *is* Hugo-eligible. It qualifies under the "related subjects" portion for the

Long Form category. Previous NASA-related stories included The Right Stuff and Apollo 13.

- 2. Stranger Things, Season One - "In a small town where everyone knows everyone, a peculiar incident starts a chain of events that leads to the disappearance of a child which begins to tear at the fabric of an otherwise peaceful community." Stanger Things follows a bunch of geeky kids growing up in the '80s. (In the '80s, I was a geeky kid. The show is like revisiting my childhood and is a blast from the past.) It's also amazingly well-written and -acted. I couldn't stop watching the season.
- 3. Arrival This is the best cerebral science fiction movie I've seen in a long time. Two human scientists attempt to learn how to talk to aliens. While that sounds boring, the movie turned out to be very engaging, intelligent, and thought-provoking.
- 4. Deadpool While not the first R-rated superhero movie, Deadpool is probably the funniest superhero movie I've ever seen. Ryan Reynolds was born to play Deadpool, an amazing anti-hero. Funny, funny, funny, and so politically INcorrect.
- 5. Rogue One This story of a suicide mission set in the Star Wars universe is the first movie that is not part of the "Skywalker triple trilogy". The main cast are characters new to the Star Wars movie universe and blended well with characters already introduced in previous Star Wars movies. It is also the first Star Wars movie without a John Williams musical score; Michael Giacchino did a great job writing Star Wars music.
- 6. Ghostbusters This is a comedy about four misfits who save New York City from an infestation of ghosts. While the female comedians busting ghosts in this movie are extremely funny, this third movie in the series is effectively a remake of the original movie. I think it would have worked so much better if the movie had been set in a different locale and didn't rely on filling the movie with so many Easter egg homages to the original movie. ΛΨΦ
