Adam West Remembrance (1928 – 2017)

As you may have heard Adam West passed away June 9, 2017 after a short battle with leukemia. He was 88 years old.

I remember watching him in the title role of Batman as a kid. My mom didn't like my brother and me watching TV, so when we got home from school we'd go to a friend's house to watch it. I loved the campy show and how West played the role of Batman seriously despite the silliness going on around him. He was also really hot. In the final episode of the Batman TV series, "Minerva, Mayhem and Millionaires", Bruce Wayne visits a spa. As you can see from the picture shown above-right, woof!

After *Batman*, West had trouble finding work, as he had been typecast as the campy Caped Crusader. Luckily, he had a lot of success doing voiceover work. He was cast as Mayor Adam West on *Family Guy* in 2000 and continued to play the role of Mayor



West until his death. West pre-recorded five more episodes as Mayor West that will be released post-humously as part of *Family Guy*'s sixteenth season.

[Ye Olde Editor's Note: I remember first seeing him, in a very limited role, in Robinson Crusoe on Mars (1964). He also made an appearance – as himself – in an episode of The Big Bang Theory. The arguments over who was "the best Batman" were a hoot!]
