Minutes of the July LSF Meeting taken by Scott

Film News: Rob enjoyed Ant Man and the Wasp but was underwhelmed by Jurassic World: Fallen Kingdom. The next "Marvel Cinematic Universe" movie will be Captain Marvel (March, 2019). David said he enjoyed the preview of The House with a Clock in Its Walls (based upon the 1973 book by John Bellairs that was illustrated by Edward Gorey). Fantastic Beasts: Crimes of Grindelwald is due out in November. David also remarked that the direct-to-digital release of the movie UFO (starring Gillian Anderson) might not be total crap. (We shall see.)

TV News: Teresa said that BBC's *Humans* is back on AMC (third season). There was a leak of a 58-second clip of the new *Doctor Who* – apparently of the Doctor and two of her companions. Teresa loves *The Magicians* – in Season 3, magic is turned off and then restored. David says that *Charmed* is being rebooted by CW this Autumn; it will be a primarily Latina cast. He also reported that *Timeless* has been cancelled.

Other News: Three recent genre deaths were discussed: author Harlan Ellison; comic book illustrator Steve Ditko; and author/editor Gardner Dozois. General question: What movie and TV show previews will be shown at ComicCon 2018?

Rob passed around the final two print editions of the *Sigma* newsletter from the Pittsburgh-area sci fi group Parsec.

Upcoming LSF book discussions: *Moonstruck: Magic to Brew*, a graphic novel by Grace Ellis (July 26); *Station 11* by Emily St. John Mandel (Aug. 23); *The Prey of Gods* by Nicky Drayden (Sept. 27).

Steve Ditko 1927 – 2018


If you're a long-time fan of superhero comics, then you're also probably a long-time fan of Steve Ditko. His style is instantly recognizable; and he is best known for his classic illustrations of Spider-Man and Doctor Strange. (He was also the co-creator – with Stan Lee – of both characters.)

Inspired by his father's love of newspaper comic strips (such as Hal Foster's *Prince Valiant*), Ditko was turned on by the introduction in 1940 of Jerry Robinson's *Batman* and Will Eisner's *The Spirit*. After graduating high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Army (1945) and served in postwar Germany, where he drew comics for an Army newspaper. Following his discharge, he moved to New York City and enrolled (under the G.I. Bill) in the Cartoonists and Illustrators School), where Jerry Robinson was teaching.

Ditko began professionally illustrating comic books for Key Publications in early 1953; his first published works were: "Paper Romance" (Daring Love #1; Oct. 1953) and "Stretching Things" (Fantastic Fear #5; Feb. 1954). He soon found work at the studio of writer-artists Joe Simon and Jack Kirby, beginning as an inker on backgrounds. In 1954, he also began a long association with Charlton Comics, and he would continue to work for Charlton intermittently until its demise in 1986.

After recovering from tuberculosis at his parents' home, Ditko returned to NYC in late 1955 and began drawing for Atlas Comics (the precursor

Harlan Ellison 1934 – 2018

It's pretty much impossible to effectively summarize Harlan Ellison's life and achievements in anything short of a massive tome. The anecdotes and attributed antics alone would fill a large-sized volume.

Ellison was, above all, a writer and was known for (to quote Wikipedia) "his prolific and influential work in New Wave speculative fiction, and for his outspoken combative personality."

Ellison was born in Cleveland, Ohio. He ran away from home frequently, taking on a wide range of odd jobs in various other states. He attended Ohio State University for 18 months (1951-1953) before being expelled – supposedly for hitting a professor who had denigrated his writing ability. (And, over the next 20 years, sent said professor a copy of every story he published.)

After publishing two stories in the *Cleveland News* (1949) and selling a story to EC Comics (early 1950s), Ellison moved to New York City (1955) to pursue his writing career, primarily in F&SF. While serving in the U.S. Army, his first novel was published: *Web of the City* (1958, based on his experiences going under cover in a street gang).

In 1962, Ellison moved to California and began to sell his writing to Hollywood. He co-wrote the screen-play

for *The Oscar* (1966) and sold scripts to various TV series, including *The Loretta Young Show*, *The Flying Nun*, *Route* 66, *The Alfred Hitchcock Hour*, and *The Man from UNCLE*.

Perhaps his most famous sci-fi TV scripts are "Soldier" and "Demon with a Glass Hand" (*The Outer Limits*, 1964) and "The City on the Edge of Forever" (*Star Trek*, 1967). He served as creative consultant to the 1980s version of *The Twilight Zone* and *Babylon 5*. He even made an on-screen appearance as a "Psi Cop" in the *Babylon 5* episode "The Face of the Enemy" (1997).

Over the years, Ellison used a number of different pen names, including Cordwainer Bird, Jay Charby, Sley Harson, Ellis Hart, John Magnus, Paul Merchant, Pat Roeder, Ivar Jorgenson, Derry Tiger, Harlan Ellis, and Jay Solo. His output – short stories, novellas, screenplays, comic book scripts, teleplays, and essays – was massive.

Ellison won: eight Hugo Awards (plus a "shared" Hugo for the screenplay of his novel *A Boy and His Dog*); four Nebula Awards; five Bram Stoker Awards (horror stories); two Edgar Awards (mystery stories); two World Fantasy Awards; two George Méliès Fantasy Film Awards; The World Fantasy Award for Life Achievement (1993); induction to the Science Fiction Hall of Fame (2011); and at least a dozen other awards. Perhaps his best-known works are: the short stories "'Repent, Harlequin!' Said the Ticktockman" (1965) and "I Have No Mouth and I Must Scream" (1967); the ground-breaking anthologies he gathered and edited, *Dangerous Visions* (1967) and *Again, Dangerous Visions* (1972); and his collected essays of opinion about TV, *The Glass Teat* (1970) and *The Other Glass Teat* (1975).

of Marvel Comics); he contributed many stories to Atlas/ Marvel's *Strange Tales*, *Amazing Adventures*, *Strange Worlds*, *Tales of Suspense*, and *Tales to Astonish*. Spider-Man, co-created by Ditko and Lee, first appeared in *Amazing Fantasy* #15 (Aug. 1962); and Doctor Strange first appeared in *Strange Tales* #110 (July 1963). The Ditko-Lee collaboration also resulted in such other memorable characters as Doctor Octopus, the Green Goblin, Baron Mordo, the Dread Dormammu, and Eternity. After being the exclusive artist on *The Amazing Spider-Man* and the "Doctor Strange" features, Ditko left Marvel in 1966 for unspecified reasons.

Ditko continued to work for Charlton and also for DC Comics, where he illustrated such characters as the Blue Beetle, the Creeper, Hawk and Dove, and Shade the Changing Man. He also began contributing to small independent publishers. He returned to Marvel as a freelancer in 1979.



In 1967, Wally Wood's *witzend* #3 saw the premiere of Ditko's solely-owned "Mr. A", a controversial hard-liner crime-fighter influenced by Ditko's deep interest in Ayn Rand's philosophy of Objectivism.

Ditko retired from mainstream comics in 1998; but many collections of his works have appeared since then.

Ditko won numerous awards for his work on *Spider-Man*. In 1987, he was presented *in absentia* with the Comic-Con International Inkpot Award – he refused the award, saying: "Awards bleed the artist and make us compete against each other." He was inducted into the Jack Kirby Hall of Fame in 1990 and into the Will Eisner Award Hall of Fame in 1994.
