

Everyone agreed it was nice to see Marina Sirtis on a recent episode of Orville! ΔΨΦ






A Different Interpretation of "DC Pride"

#### Dinosaurs in DC! info passed along by Carl

On June 8th, The Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History will open its new 31,000-square-foot fossil hall. The centerpiece of the new hall will be a skeleton of "the Nation's *T. rex*", which is on loan for 50 years from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.



The fossil hall has been closed since 2014 for renovations, including mechanical, electrical, and infrastructure renovations as well as conservation and study of its specimens by Smithsonian scientists. The new hall is called "The David H. Koch Hall of Fossils". It will feature the Tyrannosaurus rex skeleton along with more than 700 specimens of dinosaurs, plants, animals, and insects - some never before displayed at the museum. Says Kirk Johnson (Sant Director of the National Museum of Natural History): "This hall will be unlike any other-it begins in the past and ends in the future. Using extraordinary fossils, compelling interactive and multimedia experiences, and the latest science, visitors will be inspired by the fascinating story of our evolving planet and the life that has inhabited it and understand the critical role they each play in determining its future."

The National Museum of Natural History is open daily from 10 AM to 5:30 PM (closed Dec. 24). Admission is free. For more information, visit its website:

*Meanwhile*, summer visitors to the National Zoo can travel back millions of years at a couple of "Dino Summer" features: "Erth's Dinosaur Zoo Live" (an experiential theater production) and "DinoRoars" (an outdoor exhibit).



"DinoRoars" (June 1 to August 31) is an outdoor exhibit of six massive animatronic dinosaurs that move and roar, including a 39-foot-long, roaring *Tyrannosaurus rex*. Other creatures featured in the exhibit are: Compsognathus, Dilophosaurus, Parasaurolophus (and babies), Stegosaurus (and baby), and Quetzalcoatlus (and babies). Each dinosaur is fitted with electronic brains to activate and control movements and produce the sounds. Admission to the Zoo and to "DinoRoars" is free.



"Erth's Dinosaur Zoo Live" (opening June 1) is a ticketed 30-minute indoor show at the Zoo's air-conditioned Visitor Center Theater. It takes audiences on a prehistoric journey to meet a menagerie of prehistoric creatures. It features life-sized dinosaur puppets brought to life by sophisticated design, theatrical presentation, and puppet mastery. The interactive production features 19 creatures on stage, including Triceratops, Trex, Meganeura (a giant Carboniferous dragonfly), Leaellynasaura, and Titanosaur. This is part of the North American tour of "Erth's Dinosaur Zoo Live", created by Australia's Erth Visual & Physical, Inc. Shows are at 10:30 AM, 1:30 PM, and 4:30 PM, Tuesday through Sunday. Tickets are \$10 for adults (\$8 for children), with discounts available to FONZ members and groups of four-ormore (the "four-asaurus" ticket pack). An exclusive photo experience with a dinosaur puppet will also be available; it's built into the "four-asaurus" ticket packs.

*Meanwhile*... Look! Up in the sky! It's a bird! It's a plane! No, it's a multi-colored dinosaur skeleton on top of a DC hotel!




Yes, indeed, there's a 30-footlong replica of the skeleton of a *Velafrons* ("sailed forehead") dinosaur, a species of lambeosaurid "duck-bill" from Mexico. And he's known as "Ichiro, the Dino".

Ichiro is the creation of artist Marianela Fuentes. She originally built Ichiro for display at Burning Man; and she decorated the skeletal replica with colorful designs inspired by Mexico's ancient Huichol tribe. Fuentes had joined the paleontologists who originally found the fossils on Huichol tribal land; and she describes the designs as "an altar to ancient times". Ichiro currently sits high atop the Eaton Hotel (1201 "K" St. NW), overlooking Franklin Square. Ichiro is illuminated at night (in electric purple) and is visible from several buildings along the K Street Corridor.

After July, Ichiro will move on to his next destination, a public venue in San Jose CA.
