Aron Eisenberg

Aron Eisenberg appeared in 26 productions for 30 years, from 1989 to 20 Me He was best known for his role as Nog (Quarks's nephew) in 40 episodes of *Deep Space 9*. His character added a non-Federation perspective to the *Deep Space 9* universe, though, ironically, he joined the Federation and lost a leg in the Dominion War.

Aron Eisenberg was born with only one partially functioning kidney, which contributed to his limited growth to 5 feet tall. He received a kidney transplant at the age of 17 and another one in 2015. Unfortunately, he died of kidney failure.

In 2018, Eisenberg married Malíssa Longo. In addition to acting, he opened his own gallery as a professional photographer. He also performed on stage and occasionally directed for the theater.

For seven years on *Star Trek: Deep Space* 9, Eisenberg developed the character of Nog from the comic sidekick of Jake Sisco to a decorated Star Fleet veteran of the Dominion War. Eisenberg's contributions to the show added to the rich tapestry of *Deep Space* 9 that I enjoyed so much. He will be missed.

Terrence Dicks

One of my childhood heroes, Terrence Dicks, passed away on August 29th. He was a British author, television screenwriter, script editor, and producer.

When I was a teenager in the '80s, I discovered what was to become my favorite show of all time, *Doctor Who*. Back then, I saw half-hour episodic stories staring Tom Baker as The Doctor. I had no clue that three actors had preceded him in the lead. There were no VCRs or on-demand streaming services, so if I missed an episode, I would have to wait several months for that episode to be repeated. Also, I had missed eleven seasons of the show that were not being repeated anywhere.

Then I discovered the novelizations of all the stories, from an imprint affectionately known as Target Books. Through these books I discovered a much broader world of *Doctor Who*, which helped cement my love of the show.

The majority of these books were written by Terrance Dicks. Terrance Dicks novelized 67 televised stories. Initially these novelizations were only available in the UK; and it was difficult for me to get them. Eventually they started being released in the US; and it was always a treat to find a new novelization. I read them as quickly as possible and still have the complete collection today.

Terrance Dicks's association with *Doctor Who* began with his working on the show itself in 1968 and continued until his death. He was a script editor, screenwriter and producer for the show, as well as being instrumental in the development of the Doctors on planet Gallifrey and of Time Lord society.

In addition to *Doctor Who*, Terrance Dicks worked on many other TV shows, including *Space 1999*; and he wrote many non-*Doctor Who*-related books. He was a great ally to *Doctor Who* fandom; and he will be sorely missed.
