Discussions during the January LSF meeting raised a couple of questions about aspects of Queer culture.

The first question involved the meaning of the acronym "QUILTBAG." It was yet another effort some years ago to find an acceptable all-inclusive term for the Queer community, as coined by Sadie Lee (2006). There isn't a solid consensus on the exact meaning of the acronym. It seems to have meant: Queer (or Questioning), Undecided, Intersex, Lesbian, Transgender (or Transsexual), Bisexuals, Allied (or Asexual), and Gay (or Genderqueer). I can't say as I've seen QUILTBAG used very much in the last decade or so – perhaps people no longer find it a satisfactory referential term.

The other question involved the origin of the Lambda (1) as a symbol of the Gay (now Queer) community. No one seems to have a definitive answer. Some people suggest that it's simply a lower-case **L** and that it stands for "liberation."

Here's what the *Encyclopedia* of *Homosexuality* says: "In the early 1970s, in the wake of the Stonewall Rebellion, New York City's Gay Activists Alliance selected the letter lambda, which member Tom Doerr suggested from its scientific use to designate *kinetic potential* as the emblem."

Another source says that Doerr meant the lambda to symbolize the liberation that is achievable through activism – a catalyst symbolizing the exchange of energy. He also designed the lambda flag: a "chrome yellow" lambda on a blue field.







Second Asteroid in at the Kill?

A newly-discovered crater suggests that a second asteroid impact may have contributed to the great end-of-Cretaceous extinction about 66 million years ago.

When the Chicxulub asteroid crashed into the Yucatan area, its impact was massive. Wildfires rages across continents, tsunamis crashed into coastlines, and about three-quarters of existing species went extinct.

Now scientists have discovered what might be an impact crater off the coast of Guinea that also seems to date to about 66 million years ago. Veronica Bray (a planetary scientist from the University of Arizona) is a co-author of a study published in *Science Advances*. She said the following during an interview for *National Geographic*: "A lot of people have questioned: How could the Chicxulub impact—albeit a huge one—be so globally destructive? ... It might have had help."

It's theorized that a second asteroid might have broken off from the much-larger Chicxulub asteroid - or it might have been part of a closely-timed asteroid cluster. In 2020, researchers were examining seismic survey data when they discovered this second crater. They called it the Nadir crater, naming it after a nearby underwater volcano. The study's co-authors (Veronica Bray, Uisdean Nicholson, and Sean Gulick) reported: "Among the flat, layered sediments of the Guinea Plateau, west of Africa, was what appeared to be a large crater, a little under 10 km wide and several hundred meters deep, buried below several hundred meters of sediment." Scientists haven't yet con-



firmed that the Nadir crater was made by an asteroid; but Bray, Nicholson, and Gulick write that features of the crater (its scale, the ratio of height to width, the height of the crater rim) are consistent with an impact origin – and deposits around the Nadir crater look like materials ejected from a crater after a collision.

If it was in fact the result of an impact, computer models indicate that the asteroid would likely have been about 0.25 miles across and hit an ocean that was more than 2,600 feet deep. (In comparison, the Chicxulub asteroid was likely around 6 miles wide.) The Nadir hit would have caused shock waves equivalent to an earthquake of 6.5 or 7 magnitude and would have triggered underwater landslides and a series of tsunamis.

Scientists will need to drill into the formation and collect samples in order to verify whether Nadir was truly formed by an asteroid strike, as well as to arrive at a more precise date for the collision and determine its possible connection to Chicxulub. The team has applied for emergency funding for this additional research.
